Richard Knepp, Guitar

Richard Knepp is quickly becoming one of the most recognized Classical guitarists to emerge from the southeast. He received his Bachelors degree in music performance from Georgia College & State University under the direction of Terry Cantwell, and completed his graduate studies at Georgia State University under the direction of acclaimed guitar instructor John Sutherland. He was selected to study with Christopher Parkening at his annual masterclass held at Montana State University.

Aquiles Delle Vigne, Piano

Born in Argentina, Aquiles Delle Vigne gave his first recital at the age of 8. At 17 he was already a disciple of Claudio Arrau and won the prestigious Grand Prix "Albert Williams", the most renowned competition in South America. This award opened the doors of the most important concert halls of the continent for him. Considered as a leading teacher in the world, Aquiles Delle Vigne gives frequent masterclasses internationally.

Dr. David F. Oliver, Organ

David F. Oliver, a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee, completed his undergraduate studies at Wheaton College, his Master of Music Degree in Organ Performance from the New England Conservatory of Music, and his DMA in Organ Performance from the University of South Carolina. In 1995, Dr. Oliver was appointed Organist/Artist in Resident at Morehouse College in Atlanta where he is now Assistant Professor of Music. He also served as organist for the King Memorial Church in Atlanta, and maintains a prestigious concert career.
